## St. Walburg Monastery Members Elect Sr. Aileen Bankemper to the Office of Prioress

In speaking with Sr. Aileen Bankemper about her election as prioress, she related that the most common remark from everyone has been, "Should I offer you congratulations or condolences"? Her

response: "Both comments seem fitting. It is indeed a sacred privilege to be chosen as prioress by the community and the support and affirmation I have received is a blessing." To the condolence part of the question, perhaps instead the question is "are you ready for the many changes that will take place in your life?"

Most of Sister Aileen's ministry involved direct service. Earlier she served as both teacher and nurse. For the past 40 years she ministered as a therapist, many of those years at Catholic Charities of the Diocese of Coving-



ton. Since 2000 she has worked as a licensed psychologist in private practice on the monastery grounds. In addition for the past fifteen years she has worked as a group facilitator at Cancer Support Community for persons dealing with a cancer diagnosis and as a volunteer psychologist at the women's prison in Lexington, KY. It is difficult to leave work that she has loved and has ministered in for so many years. And she says, "I am very familiar with my past work and I am not as sure about the future, the challenges, and the many unknowns."

Listening is at the core of Benedictine life. Listening as a prioress will be more all-encompassing than as a therapist; it involves all aspects of monastic life. Chapter 2 of the Rule of St. Benedict is one of the longest chapters, describing in great detail the role of the abbot/prioress. Benedict's expectations are challenging, not allowing for slackers! Some examples: "she must lead . . . more by example than by words;" "show equal love to everyone;" " know what a difficult burden she has undertaken" (these are some of the easier admonitions!). It's a good thing that Sr. Aileen has received the promise of prayers from her sisters and many others.

As she looks forward to assuming this new role of service to the community, Sr. Aileen says that through every part of her life she has known the loving presence of God. She is counting on nothing changing that; God's love is a sure source of hope and peace.

God's blessings on Sr. Aileen, our new prioress.

The contents of the Knoll House -- in addition to many articles acquired from other areas -- were available to purchasers -- mostly employees, teachers, parents, oblates and friends. Bargains were plentiful. Early December--Ryan Ecken, a young man from Louisville, had inquired about the possibility of residing on the monastery grounds while attending Xavier University for a degree in nursing. Since Cottage 7 has been vacant, he was invited to take up residence there in early January. Ryan is married and his wife, Erica, who works in Louisville, is able to spend some weekends at the Cottage. Ryan joins the community frequently for Eucharist and Liturgy of the Hours. December 3-- Sr. Rita Brink has been mentioned in these Chronicles for many years -- most recently as administrator at St. Joseph Monastery, St. Mary's, PA. She returns to St. Walburg Monastery periodically for much appreciated visits, as she continues her service to communities of the Federation of St. Scholastica. In early December she traveled to St. Scholastica Monastery, Chicago, to facilitate community meetings as they work toward mapping out their future. She will return monthly until May to assist them. December 13--Villa Madonna Academy seniors and their teacher, Eileen O'Connell, recently made a trip to the monastery cemetery, visiting graves of the Sisters. Each of the seniors chose the name from one of the markers and wanted to know something about that Sister. Eileen gave Sr. Mary Rabe a list of the names and they were distributed to Sisters who gathered information. Today the seniors came to the lower level of the monastery to hear about those deceased Sisters. It was a mutual learning experience for everyone who participated. December 3 – 24-- Advent was the shortest possible this year of 2017! Beginning

with the first Sunday of Advent on Dec. 3, the 4th Sunday of Advent was Christmas Eve. These three weeks were full of activity, including parties for the employees, the Monastery and VMA Boards of Directors, faculty of VMA and other smaller groups. Much of the activity took place in the monastery lower level and kitchen. On Dec. 21 the community decorated the large trees in the refectory and infirmary lounge and celebrated later with the Christmas Party.

December 24 – January 1--On the last Sunday of Advent, the community celebrated with a feastday supper since many sisters would be with family on Christmas Day. After supper, the community adjourned to the Lower Level where a dessert party followed and the exchange of gifts. At the Christmas Day brunch the culinary creations of the Sisters were featured. The octave of Christmas saw many visitors at St. Walburg Monastery. On Dec. 31, New Year's Eve, the community enjoyed a dessert party at which names for prayer partners for 2018 were drawn. Shortly after the octave of Christmas, Epiphany and the Baptism of Jesus ended the Christmas season and Ordinary Time resumed, a change from the festivity of Christmas.

January 16 – Sr. Philomena Rarreick died peacefully this morning in the infirmary. She had been anointed by **Rev.** Robert Henderson shortly before she died. Sr. Philomena had been a Benedictine Sister for 66 years! The vigil service and visitation took place the evening of Jan. 21 with remembrances of her by relatives, friends and community. Mass of Christian burial was celebrated by **Rev.** William Neuhaus on Jan. 22. Rev. Robert Reinke, a faithful friend for many years, was able to be present for the vigil and Mass. ## Sister Philomena Rarreick, 1930-2018

**Sister Philomena Rarreick** was born on June 6, 1930 to **Sidney and Laura McElfresh Rarreick** near Falmouth, KY. Named Sarretta, she was the youngest of four children. Lavonne and Eupha, her sisters, and Vincent, her brother, are deceased.

Sarretta's mother Laura died in 1935, and all four children lived and were educated at St. John's Orphanage. Sarretta was baptized there in 1937.

She entered St. Walburg Monastery in 1949 and received the name Sister Philomena when she became a novice in 1950. First profession followed in 1951, and perpetual profession in 1954. Sr. Philomena celebrated her silver jubilee in 1976, her golden in 2001, and diamond in 2011.

taught primary grades in La Junta, CO; Danville, Manchester and Georgetown, Kentucky, and at St. Paul's and St. Henry's in Northern Kentucky. From 1981 to 1991 she worked at the Cathedral Child Development Center, now Children, Inc.

Sr. Philomena was no stranger to a sewing machine. As a seamstress she made and repaired quite a number of daily use items for sisters. She enjoyed working with her hands, making and fixing rosaries. She did needlework and knitted hats for a hospital's newborn babies and for agencies who distributed them to those in need of a warm hat.

Sr. Philomena died peacefully on January 16, 2018. Her parents, sisters, brother, and one nephew have gone before her in death; she is survived by many nieces and nephews.

Vigil service was held the evening of Sunday, January 21 with the Mass of Christian Burial at 5:00 pm, Monday, January 22 at St. Walburg Monastery. Sr. Philomena was interred in St. Walburg Monastery Cemetery on Tuesday morning, January 23.

## Sister Esther O'Hara, 1929-2018

**Sister Esther O'Hara** was born on December 14, 1929 to **William and Marie Wischer O'Hara and named Laverne. She** was one of seven children, having two sisters and four brothers. One sister died as an infant.

After graduation from St. Henry High School Laverne entered St. Walburg Monastery in 1947. She became a novice in 1948 and received the name Sister Esther. First profession followed in 1949

and perpetual profession in 1952. Sister Esther celebrated her silver jubilee in 1974, her golden in 1999, and her diamond in 2009.

Sister Esther graduated from Villa Madonna College in 1957 with a BA in Elementary Education. In 1965 she earned a certificate in Library Science, also from VMC.

Over many years of service Sister Esther worked in a variety of fields. She taught children

with cerebral palsy and served in a number of diocesan elementary schools. One year she was organist at Mary Queen of Heaven, although she said later, "All I knew how to play was *O Salutaris*." Following her teaching years came nearly a decade as a school librarian on both sides of the Ohio River. Next Sr. Esther spent several years transporting sisters to doctors, and even doing routine car maintenance. The children at Villa Hills Day Care got to know her during the three years she spent there. Other children knew her as a Zoo volunteer.

What may have been Sr. Esther's favorite pursuit was the field of storytelling and ventriloquism. A member of the Greater Cincinnati Storytelling Guild for 12 years, she was sought after for events for children. She had quite a family of puppets, and would show off photos of them the way others share pictures of grandchildren. A skilled balloon sculptor, there seemed to be no animal she couldn't fashion.

Sr. Esther died peacefully on January 31, 2018. She is survived by two brothers and many nieces and nephews. Vigil service was held the evening of Tuesday, February 6 and the Mass of Christian Burial on Wednesday, February 7 at 5:00 pm. She was interred in St. Walburg Monastery Cemetery.

mayors of the county and over forty other interested persons. The agenda included issues facing the county and sharing information. **Maureen Smain**, our monastery chef, arranged and served the breakfast through the Smain Family Catering Service.

That afternoon the community met to discuss "Direction Statements for 2018-22". After much discussion and many suggestions, a writing committee took the community input and prepared the final statements for approval by the community. The discernment process and election of prioress is scheduled for the weekend of April 5 - 8.

January 25 - A service, *United in Prayer* was held at the Main Strasse Bell Tower in Covington at 6:00 p.m. It was hosted by the Benedictine Sisters, the Sisters of Divine Providence and the Sisters of Notre Dame. Representatives of these communities and many lay people participated in this prayer for World Peace.

January 26-28-- Sr. Aileen Bankemper traveled to St. Walburga Monastery, Elizabeth, N.J. to facilitate a workshop and discernment process for the election of their next prioress.

January 27 – Sr. Nancy Kordenbrock, our community treasurer, served as Chief Official at the Governor's Cup District competition held at Beechwood High School today. Sr. Nancy is currently teaching three biology classes daily at VMA for six weeks, substituting for Mrs. Molly Miller who was on maternity leave. At the Beechwood competition five teams participated: Dixie Heights, Beechwood, Ludlow, Lloyd and Villa Madonna Academy with about 15 members on each team. In the final result, VMA achieved over-all first place in the competition which included written exams, quick recall, composition and future problem solving. It was a long and challenging day – and an honor for VMA. January 28-29-- Sr. Mary Catherine Wenstrup left for St. Scholastica Monastery, Boerne, TX to assist the community in preparing for the election of their prioress. She will return to Boerne at the end of February to assist in the election.

January 29-February 2--Catholic Schools Week was observed at Villa Madonna Academy with students from kindergarten through 6th grade visiting our monastery on various days. Community members greeted them in the main dining room and participated in games, presentations by students and interesting conversations about themselves and their school. Students from the high school attended Mass at the monastery on Tuesday and brought their lunches to dine with the Sisters. On Thursday the high school attended Mass in the VMA theater to which the community was invited.

On the morning of February 5 students of grades 3 and 4 from **Holy Family Schoo**l, Covington, visited the Monastery with their teachers. They enjoyed games and conversations with the Sisters.

January 31-- After a number of years in the infirmary with declining health, Sr. Esther O'Hara died peacefully today. Sr. Esther served God and this community in a variety of fields—mostly with young children as teacher, librarian, story teller and ventriloquist. She was always greatly in demand by children's groups with her photographs, puppets and balloons. A display of a great number of photographs, her puppets and printed articles of all kinds attested to her talents and hobbies. (See p. 5 for obituary.)

Sisters Mary Catherine Wenstrup and Rita Brink were present for the first part of the meeting; however, they left early to return home for the funeral services of Sr. Esther. The large gathering of supporters included former students, teachers, parents and friends. ## Sister Margaret Mary Dressman 1923-2018

**Sister Margaret Mary Dressman** was born on December 29, 1923 to **James and Mary Teresa Hoover Dressman.** She was one of nine children, having five sisters and three brothers.

After graduation from Holy Cross High School, Margaret Mary entered St. Walburg Monastery in 1941. She became a novice in 1942 and received the name Sister Boniface. First profession followed



in 1943 and perpetual profession in 1946. Sister Margaret Mary celebrated her silver jubilee in 1968, her golden in 1993, and her diamond in 2003.

Sister Margaret Mary graduated from Villa Madonna College in 1964 with a BA in Elementary Education. In 1971-72 she received certification as school librarian 1-12 from Northern Kentucky State and UK's extension program.

Sister Margaret Mary contracted TB in her early years in the community and spent four years recovering

in the infirmary. Those long years were significant in her life story. She served for a few years as dietician in two hospitals in Colorado, one year teaching in Colorado, and twenty years as teacher in elementary schools of the Diocese of Covington. After she was certified as a school librarian, Sr. Margaret Mary served in that capacity for another twenty-four years at St. Henry Elementary and Holy Cross High School.

Sr. Margaret Mary resided at the monastery from 1972 on. Until she fell this year she walked without any mobility aids. She prayed enthusiastically and faithfully at the Liturgy of the Hours and at Eucharist. When any recreational activity took place in the infirmary lounge, Margaret Mary was an avid player, whether at cards, Scrabble or any other type of competition. She will be remembered for her wit.

Sr. Margaret Mary broke her hip this year, rehabbed at Madonna Manor, and returned home recently. She died suddenly on April 8, 2018. She is survived by two brothers and five sisters. Vigil service was held the evening of Tuesday, April 10 and the Mass of Christian Burial on Wednesday, April 11, 2018. She was interred in St. Walburg Monastery Cemetery.

## At the Feet of Montserrat – A Reflection on My Stay at St. Walburg Monastery by Ryan Ecken

Saint Ignatius of Loyola leaves us with a beautiful image in his autobiography--that of his conversion experience at the Benedictine monastery in Montserrat, Spain. He kept vigil for a whole night in front of the statue of Our Lady of Monserrat and "resolved to lay aside his garments and don the armor of Christ." What enthralls me the most about this scene is that which is imagined and not told. What is it about this moment in the young Ignatius's life that had such a profound effect on him?

What my mind sees in that moment is a remorseful young man – haunted by a past of vanity but at the same time utterly overwhelmed by the true, irrational love of Christ – kneeling at the feet of the Black Madonna and Son bedecked in gold. As Ignatius suffers this healing agony of surrender, a son of Benedict, in route to his prayer stall for the liturgical prayer of Vespers, gently wraps his hospitable arm around the vulnerable, crooked-leg soldier.



I cannot help but to wonder if it was this imagined experience of the guest Ignatius being received like Christ that would influence this great Saint's teaching of finding God in all things?

While my mind's construct may be one that is far-fetched, it is one that is rooted in my experience at St. Walburg Monastery. I am the young Ignatius who has been embraced by this community's hospitable arms. With my wife **Erica** still in Louisville *(pictured above with Ryan)* and house payments there, I could not afford to rent or buy another abode as I embarked on my journey as a nursing student at Xavier University. The prospect of not having a place to rest my head brought me to my knees at the feet of Montserrat, and in my moment of confusion the gentle hand of this community touched my shoulder and brought



me to my feet, gracing me with the humble Cottage 7 *(See picture left).* At this place, finding God in all things is as natural as breathing. The welcoming nature of Christ that the sisters personify draws all sorts of creation. I cannot count the number of times I stood in the kitchen of Cottage 7 – cleaning *Continued on p. 15*

Eleven women attended the retreat sponsored and conducted by Sr. Mary Tewes and Jeanne Hunt. Sr. Mary was Director of Religious Education at the parish for 20 years. It was a leisurely, prayerful two days around the theme **PUSH**, ways of stimulating oneself through winter and Lent. Sr. Emmanuel Pieper and Laura Tewes assisted during the Saturday afternoon personal time. Those attending enjoyed living at the Guest House and time spent at the monastery. March 3--The Center of Spirituality sponsored a day of reflection with presenter Rev. cess for the election of a prioress who will serve for the next four years. Sr. Susan Quaintance of Chicago and Sr. Elaine Fischer of Atchison, Kansas facilitated the discernment process. Sr. Lynn McKenzie, president of the Federation of St. Scholastica, presided at the Chapter of Election held on the afternoon of April 7. Sr. Aileen Bankemper was chosen as the thirteenth prioress of the community. (See article about Sr. Aileen on p. 3.)

April 8--Sr. Margaret Mary Dressman, a long-time resident of the infirmary, died suddenly. She had her picture taken with the rest of the community, looking well and smiling in her wheelchair, but an hour or so later her heart stopped. (See p. 6 for obituary)

April 11-13--Sr. Kimberly Porter was at St. Scholastica Monastery in Fort Smith, Arkansas to facilitate a workshop on the *Art of Simplicity* as part of their Spring Community days. Because of heavy storms and tornado warnings, Sr. Kimberly could not leave on the day she planned. She attended a St. Walburg Monastery Council meeting by telephone.

April 17--Sr. Mary Tewes received a call from Karen McKim, the leader of the Benedictine Spirituality Book Study Group from Trinity Episcopal Church in Covington, KY. The group of 12 have heen meeting monthly for 15 years, reading many books on Benedictine spirituality. Sr. Mary offered to guide them in *lectio* divina, the Benedictine prayer form with which they were not familiar. On Tuesday, April 17, she joined the group for a potluck supper and introduced them to lectio divina using the Gospel for the following Sunday. The group was delighted with this prayerful experience. Sr. Mary has an open invitation to join them, and they hope to visit the Monastery in the near future. April 21--Srs.
