New Development to be Called **Sanctuary**

This contract strengthens our ability to continue our presence and mission while providing for our future retirement needs. This announcement, while simple, was years in the making! The various and often unexpected steps forward reveal themselves as blessings.




Blessing

Blessing

In 2012 NRRO (National Religious Retirement Office) offered professional and financial support to help us move forward. They helped us frame our goals and provided professional consultants to guide those goals to completion.

They evaluated the health care service we provide for our elderly and infirmed members, guided us to new investment managers and provided a grant to secure a professional study of our unused property. Their funds also covered the required Title Search, ALTA study and appraisals.

Blessing

Implementing the proposal to sell the land involved working with the mayor, city officials and council of Villa Hills. These individuals understood our plan to sell property and explained to us how the development of our property could benefit the city and its residents. Meetings provided new insights, more questions for us and thought provoking observations. Throughout the process these individuals respected our need to keep the community informed and supportive before any public announcement was made or action taken. They never moved forward until we were ready.

Blessing

Members of the staff of PDS (Planning and Development Services of Kenton County) were partners and educators as we moved

onward. Under their leadership we began the process of discerning and determining new land uses for our property, at that time zoned institutional. This involved various studies: demographic, market, traffic and US



Waterways and Streams. The PDS staff consulted with public utilities and local organizations. They planned, set up and prepared us for two public meetings with the residents of the city. They walked us through the presentations to and approval from the **Kenton County Planning Commission**. They might best be compared to Sherpa guides!

Blessing

Knowing the sale of the property would be the next step, we engaged a **real estate attorney** to represent us. He was both teacher and guide assisting us in reading and responding to studies and documents related to the approval of new land uses for our property. He accompanied us to meetings and public hearings. He pushed us to identify the community's values and hopes for the new development. Those named values are: sensitivity to the environment and our neighbors, diverse housing opportunities and openness to the city's needs.

Closing thoughts

These past five years were a steep learning curve for us and, perhaps, for our partners. Every step we took was new and different. Each step of the process provided new partners, ideas and thoughts to ponder. We began to understand how what we were doing would have a real and physical effect on others, not just on ourselves. Depending on one's point of view, what might have been seen as loss or gain could also be seen as opportunity or gift.

Ashley Commercial Company will call the new development *Sanctuary*. The word stems from the Latin, *sanctus*—holy. For us and many of you, the word is identified with that place in the chapel where Eucharist is celebrated. For others it can be a place of safety. The word also reflects our understanding of hospitality and welcome. Some day in the future we will have the opportunity to welcome new neighbors.

December 24—The community had its special Christmas supper this evening.

December 25—Christmas Day began with a celebrative Liturgy of the Hours. Carols were sung and proclamation of the Birth of Christ was chanted at Eucharist which was shared with a large group of guests. December 31—Kitchen workers were off this last evening of the old year and a group of sisters assembled a delicious

for Christmas. A fabulous dessert table was part of the celebration which began after Night Prayer and continued with various games and informal conversation until 8:30 pm when we marked the beginning of the New Year with the "official" lowering of the ball in the front entrance. January 21—Much has been said within and outside the community on the prospective sale of property to assist with our retirement needs. After many preliminary discussions within the community, a task force, composed of delegates from St. Walburg Monastery, the city of Villa Hills and the Planning and Development Services of Kenton County staff (PDS) met frequently from January 2016 through the present to acquire information which would assist us in making decisions concerning the sale of the property. Today's meeting was a compilation of information gathered in the last year by the task force. Many detailed charts were available and among these were information from key persons, possible amenities to be included, land use, types of housing, and considerations regarding potential retail and transportation. Voluminous reports on all these topics were available for reading/study. Picture boards throughout the room showed suggestions for housing styles, green space and other ideas. The community is grateful for the progress made to date.

January 26-June 11—Sr. Aileen **Bankemper** has served monasteries of three federations during these months, facilitating primarily in elections and their preparations. From Jan. 26-30 she did pre-election facilitation at St. Benedict's Monastery, St. Joseph, MN and from Feb. 23-28 she facilitated the election of prioress. From Feb. 3-6 she met with the election committee of St. Scholastica Monastery, Atchison, KS. She also facilitated at St. Walburga Monastery, Elizabeth, NJ from March 10-14 and St. Scholastica Priory, Boerne, TX. She spent April 17-23 in Ft. Smith, AR at St. Scholatica Monastery where the prioress' term was extended for two more years. In June she returned to Atchison to facilitate the elec-

Sister Xavier Anneken, 1923-2017

Born March 26, 1923 in Latonia, Kentucky Entered St. Walburg Monastery December 27, 1946 Received habit, 1947 First Profession, June 29, 1948 Died May 23, 2017

Sister Xavier Anneken, OSB was born to **John H. Anneken** and **Clara Robish Anneken** on March 26, 1923 in Latonia KY and given the name Mary Martha Helen at her baptism. To her friends she was always

Marcy. She was the sixth of nine children, four boys and five girls—four of whom became Benedictine Sisters—Gemma, Clarita, Juanita and Xavier. She attended Holy Cross School for twelve years and attended Xavier Evening College for five years and worked as a bookkeeper before entering St. Walburg Monastery in 1946. She became a novice in 1947, receiving the name Sister Xavier. First profession



followed in 1948, perpetual in 1951, silver jubilee in 1973, golden in 1998 and diamond in 2008.

Sister Xavier always had a head for numbers and business. She taught for one year and served for ten years in the business office of the monastery. She received a BS degree from Xavier University in 1971. Most of her ministry was spent in the business offices of hospitals in the mountain regions of Hazard and Irvine, KY and in Colorado. She served as secretary of the community for six years, and was a member of several committees and boards. After returning to live at the monastery in 1979 Sr. Xavier served as transportation director until her retirement in 2011.

Sr. Xavier's years in the Kentucky mountains were dear to her heart. She often took camping and hiking trips with her nephews in the mountains. She had a treasure trove of stories about Eastern Kentucky. Sr. Xavier was an ardent, lifelong Cincinnati Reds fan.

Sr. Xavier was blessed with a close-knit and devoted family. Her mother had died in 1937. After her sisters entered St. Walburg Monastery much of her time was spent with her sister Rita, her brothers and their families. During Sr. Xavier's residence in the infirmary her nephews and nieces were loyal visitors.

Sr. Xavier was preceded in death by her parents and all her siblings. She is survived by the Benedictine community, nieces and nephews and many friends from the mountains. Her death occurred peacefully on May 23, 2017. Vigil for Sr. Xavier was held the evening of May 25, 2017 with Mass of Christian Burial on May 26, 2017. She is interred in St. Walburg Monastery Cemetery.

tion of the prioress on June 11. January 30—Srs. Mary Catherine Wenstrup and Rita Brink left early this morning to attend the Conference of Benedictine Prioresses held at the Redemptorist Renewal Center near Tucson, AZ. A new organizational structure was approved and officers elected. Abbot John Klaussen of St. John's Abbey, Collegeville, and Sr. Mary Irene Now**ell** of Atchison presented ten hallmarks of Benedictine Colleges and Universities. Case studies were used to help prioresses in strategies for promoting Benedictine values. Sr. Mary Catherine has shared these with the faculty, staff and students at VMA.

Jan. 30-Feb. 3—VMA celebrated Catholic Schools Week. K-sixth grade students with teachers visited St. Walburg Monastery each day, sharing information, games, history in various ways. High school and junior high students also had a week-long celebration with a multitude of daily activities.

February 4—Srs. Dorothy Schuette, Joan Fraenzle, Mariana Kirk, Sharon Portwood, Mary Carol Hellmann and Cathy Bauer attended *Catholics at the Capital*, a regional meeting highlighting upcoming legislation of concern to people of Kentucky. Representatives from the Catholic Conference of Kentucky led the meeting which focused on issues of pro-life, school choice, justice reform and health care.

February 9—Three groups of approximately 27 students and two teachers from St. Ursula Academy visited St. Walburg Monastery today. They were interested in Liturgy of the Hours. With their teacher, Linda Thomas, and Sr. Nancy Kordenbrock and Sr. Andrea Collopy, they prayed Noon Day Prayer and received information on the recitation of the Divine Office through the years.

February 25—Celebration of the Feast of St. Walburg, our monastery patroness, began with a special Mass last evening because of the Center of Spirituality program planned for today. Over a hundred persons participated in the program—including community members and visitors. Rev. Kenneth Overberg, SJ

presented *The Mystery of God and Suf- fering*. Fr. Overberg is emeritus professor of theology at Xavier University who continues to teach and write. He spoke of the suffering that surrounds us. Because Christians have focused particularly on the life, suffering and death of Jesus and how this shapes our image of God, this leads to a response of lament, action and trust. Four presentations allowed time for discussion, questions and reflection. Fr. Overberg left copies of his book, *Into the Abyss of Suffering*, which is a development and extension of today's subject.

February 27—A memorial Mass for Rev. Wilfred Fraenzle, brother of Sr. Joan, was concelebrated by Fr. Cahill and Fr. Henderson this evening. Fr. Fraenzle had served the Dioceses of Covington and Lexington, often in the mountains of Appalachia. Services for Fr. Fraenzle were held in Lexington last week. Many parishioners of the Covington Diocese honored his memory this evening.

March 4—VillaRama, the chief fundraiser for Villa Madonna Academy, celebrated its 42nd anniversary at Receptions in Erlanger this evening. A large crowd of parents, alum and friends enjoyed the silent and oral auctions and the delicious dinner. For the first time those interested in items on the silent auction could place bids from their smart phones. The oral auction, as always, was a great attraction to bidders with unusual offerings. On one occasion the donor of the item offered a duplicate when the competition got heated.

March 10—Sr. Dorothy Schuette organized a letter writing party in the infirmary lounge. A group gathered to write letters or postcards to congressional members covering many issues, specifically health care, immigration, budget. March 24-26—Once Upon a Mattress, a musical adaptation of the Princess and the Pea story, was this year's presentation by the students of Villa Madonna Academy. 
